Alabama Power Company (Alabama Power) is the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) licensee for the R.L. Harris Hydroelectric Project (Harris Project) (FERC No. 2628-066). Alabama Power filed the Final License Application (FLA) for the Harris Project on November 23, 2021. Pursuant to 18 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) 4.32 (a)(6), Alabama Power published notices of the filing twice in daily newspapers in each county in which the Harris Project is located. Attached are affidavits serving as evidence of publication of the legal notice of filing of the FLA in the *Jackson County Sentinel* on November 27, 2021 and December 4, 2021; *The Anniston Star* on December 1, 2021 and December 4, 2021; *The Clay Times Journal* on December 2, 2021 and December 9, 2021; and *The Randolph Leader* on December 1, 2021 and December 8, 2021. The Gamecocks didn't need a coach who would've used this as a trampoline job — stay one or two years and then bounce to a bigger, better job.

They needed Rodriguez, now 58, who has coached in the FBS at West Virginia, Michigan and Arizona. With 37 years in college coaching, he's got experience and perspective, and he'll be a valuable voice as the Gamecocks navigate the transition from FCS powerhouse to trying to survive in deeper, murkier FBS waters.

He's also got enthusiasm, and that was evident to JSU fans who attended Tuesday afternoon's introduction of Rodriguez.

When asked if he considers this his last football coaching job, Rodriguez said "never say never," but he also spoke about "10 or 12 years at JSU."

Later, when speaking privately with reporters, he mentioned this being the "twilight."

Of course, a bigger job might call, but it's really unlikely at this point in his career another Power Five job like Alabama, Michigan or West Virginia is going to be calling again. He'll stay, until it's time for somebody else to be the "right coach for right now."

Seitz said that more than 100 people applied for the JSU job. He wanted somebody who had a winning record and had coached at the "highest level." Rodriguez was one of 18 whom Seitz interviewed by Zoom video conferencing.

The first conversation lasted about two hours. They spoke again through Zoom and then met in person. There was a fourth Zoom conversation, and Seitz said he offered Rodriguez the job last week.

Rodriguez was presented with his contract Tuesday morning for review, and no problems are anticipated. With incentives, his pay is expected to be more than \$500,000 a year. Grass received \$300,000 a year. With JSU moving to the FBS, it was expected the school would have to pay about \$600,000.

Seitz said JSU is committed to hiring additional staff that's standard for FBS football programs, such as a full-time director of football operations, a video coordinator, and a strength-and-conditioning coach who works strictly with football.

Rodriguez has done all this, and it's nothing new for him to build the organization. Been there, done that, been given so many T-shirts, he could cover the backyard of the new house

in the area that his wife, Rita Rodriguez, will begin looking for Wednesday morning.

Rodriguez wound up at a place like JSU after getting fired at Arizona after the 2017 season. Rodriguez, his wife and the University of Arizona were sued in federal court by a former administrative assistant in July 2019, but Rodriguez and his wife were dropped from the suit in November 2019. The assistant's suit against the school was dismissed in October 2021, with both sides paying their own costs and attorney's fees, according to an ESPN report.

JSU researched the case. So did Ole Miss before hiring him as offensive coordinator in 2019. So did Louisiana-Monroe before hiring him as offensive coordinator and assistant

head coach in 2020.

None received information that said they shouldn't hire him.

In addition, Rodriguez has received criticism from his time at Michigan for how he and his staff used foul, degrading language. He even addressed that Tuesday during his introduction, saying he has worked to get better.

Seitz said afterward that while football coaches curse, if it goes overboard, it will be addressed.

Rodriguez is hardly perfect, but if he was, he wouldn't be available at JSU's level and price range. What is he? A good fit for where JSU is now.

marketing director, Tori Duncan.

Duncan said they are running low on their Old Fashion cedar trees — the tree that most people regard as "Christmas trees" — as many people have already shopped for their trees this year. However, she said they're trimming some of their larger trees down to size to make them suitable for the average sized house.

Though its Old Fashions are in "slim pickings," Westwood Plantation has an abundance of its Carolina Sapphire and Blue Ice trees. The Old Fashions are \$10 per foot, the Carolina Sapphires are \$11 per foot, and the Blue Ice trees are \$12 per foot.

"Some of our trees, like our Blue Ice trees, have taken us close to 15 years for some of them to be nine foot tall," Duncan said. "They take a long time to grow."

Duncan said though these take the longest, they are "absolutely beautiful." The Blue Ice trees have a bluish tint, looking as if they had icy frost on them.

If you're looking for a tree that will produce a nice fragrance, Duncan said their Carolina Sapphires is the way to go.

"Our Carolina Sapphires, if you want something that will smell up your whole house, that's what you need," Duncan said. "They smell so good."

Duncan said Westwood Plantation is planning a Christmas festival for Saturday, Dec. 4. She said it will have several booths of local vendors selling their wares, such as ornaments, hot cocoa bombs, and pork skins. She said a Grinch character will also be there, as will photographers and opportunities for little ones to write letters to Santa.

Duncan said she wanted to help bring awareness to small businesses in the community.

"We're trying to get as many of our little town bakeries, shops, or little booths to come out," Duncan said. "We want our small business owners to be able to make their money. We're trying to grow and we're trying to help our little town grow."

Kids run through the farm freely, people request to take discarded tree trimmings home to make wreaths — Duncan said their biggest goal is to please the customer.

"We're trying to be that hometown place that you like to go, and you feel comfortable," Duncan said. "We want everybody to just have fun and enjoy their experience here."

into the variant's penchant for spread and its ability to thwart treatments and vaccines in the confines of a lab.

It will take until early 2022 for contact-tracing teams and epidemiologists to flesh out the emerging picture with real-world data on whom omicron sickens, and the extent of their illnesses. Then mathematical modelers will plug in what's known, fill in what's not, and forecast a range of outcomes.

Until those bits and pieces of evidence begin to congeal, all we have are anecdotes, said infectious-disease specialist Dr. Joshua Schiffer of the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle, "and the anecdotes are not helpful."

The impact of the omicron variant "really needs to be assessed in a systematic way, looking at very large numbers of people," Schiffer said. "This is going to take a bit of time to parse."

Once again, the coming months will provide the public a lesson in both the science of uncertainty and the uncertainty of science. Like a jigsaw puzzle, the complete picture of omicron's impact will emerge only in pieces.

Almost two years into a pandemic, scientists need to take the measure of the SARS-CoV-2 virus yet again. This time, they have a variant changed by an unprecedented number of mutations with worrisome histories. And they are assessing its strengths and weaknesses in a diverse population of potential hosts that ranges from uninfected-and-entirely-susceptible to vaccinated-and-boosted.

"There are so many moving parts," said Dr. Jonathan Li, a Harvard infectious-disease specialist who directs the virology laboratory at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston.

It's possible that omicron's detection just happened to coincide with an isolated outbreak or superspreader event that prompted South African scientists to step up their collection of viral coronavirus specimens.

If omicron fails to gain more footholds as it lands in a wider range of places, its apparent role in driving

South Africa's latest outbreak may prove to have been a case of misattribution, Schiffer said.

Now that the omicron variant has been detected in several countries, its powers of transmission will be tested. If it's found to be gaining ground, the next challenge will be for scientists to determine whether its increased spread is a function of some innate biological advantage that helps it spread from person to person and whether it's specially equipped to evade the defenses of people who gained immunity from a vaccine or past infection.

A cursory check of omicron's constellation of mutations raises deep concerns on both fronts.

"This variant seems to have some of the greatest hits when it comes to mutations," Li said.

A good many of them are heavily concentrated along a string of genetic code that governs the shape and behavior of the spike protein, which the virus uses to latch onto human cells. Two mutations are at a site the virus uses to pry its way into those cells and hijack them for its own replication. And several more have been seen in other variants that are capable of evading antibodies made by the immune system in response to vaccines and previous infections.

That's just the beginning.

"It's not only the sheer number of mutations that's concerning, Li said. It's how broadly across the virus' genome they are

scattered, and the range of functions they have the potential to change: "It just has a lot of mutations, all over the place."

If omicron does establish itself outside southern Africa, scientists will need to gauge the relative contributions of the variant's increased transmissibility and its ability to overpower a prepared immune system. Those findings will help guide the next steps, including a potential renewal of public health measures and the reformulation of mRNA vaccines and boosters specifically tailored to thwart the new variant. Vaccine makers Pfizer and Moderna have said they could ready such vaccines in just a few months' time.

With lab studies to guide their hunches, scientists should find the task of separating increased transmissibility from so-called immune escape simple enough. If new infections linked to omicron occur primarily in unvaccinated people, heightened transmissibility would seem to be at work. If new infections are just as likely to occur in people who've been vaccinated as in those who haven't, scientists might conclude the variant has found its way around antibodies meant to block it.

But that seemingly straightforward analysis will be complicated by several factors. The COVID-19 vaccines available across the world have ranged widely in their ability to block reinfection.

The waning of vaccine-induced immunity has

thrown another wild card into the mix. If a vaccinated person has a breakthrough case involving omicron, it won't necessarily be clear whether the variant busted through the vaccine's defenses or those defenses had already fallen on their own.

If it turns out that omicron isn't readily stopped by vaccines, the world would find itself back at square one, said Dr. Charles Chiu, an infectious disease specialist at UC San Francisco.

But it may take more than that for the variant to wreak havoc, he added.

The Beta variant first seen in South Africa and the Gamma variant in Brazil both demonstrated the ability to evade vaccine defenses, Chiu said. But when they competed head-to-head against the highly transmissible delta variant in the United States and elsewhere, they didn't gain much traction, Chiu said.

The lesson: Even if omicron is adept at overcoming vaccines, its impact will be blunted if it can't unseat delta.

The final test of omicron's powers to worsen the pandemic will be to understand whether it can make people sicker and cause more deaths than the variants that have come before. If it is both more transmissible and more virulent, the

result would be disastrous, Walker said.

"That is the question that's most important to answer," he said.

But scientists will have to be patient. It typically takes at least a couple of weeks of illness for an infected person to become sick enough to be placed under intensive care or to die, Walker said. And scientists will have to meld clinical data with genetic sequencing to know whether omicron's mutations are responsible.

Tulio de Oliveira, the

South African geneticist who led the team that identified the omicron variant, said scientists across Africa will be working feverishly to collect that data over the next several weeks. He said he suspects that greater powers of both transmission and of immune escape have pushed omicron into the global spotlight. But he's reluctant to make predictions about the variant's ability to sicken.

"The next weeks are so crucial," he said.

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Hanukkah 2021

Eight things you might not know about the Jewish festival

If everything you know about Hanukkah comes from an Adam Sandler song, you are not alone.

There are many Americans out there whose only real knowledge on the subject is that Hanukkah, which is being celebrated through the evening of Monday, Dec. 6, is a festival of lights. Instead of one day of presents, the Jewish community gets the joy of eight nights of gifts.

There's much more to know about Hanukkah than that, though.

1. How to spell it

When the subject of Hanukkah comes up, do you become nervous and uncertain because you don't know whether to go with H-A-N-U-K-K-A-H or C-H-A-N-U-K-A-H, or whether it's two K's or one? Here's the deal: You probably aren't wrong. The Hebrew word when transliterated into English, translators sometimes go with C-H and sometimes go with just an H, both of which approximate the guttural "kh" sound that starts the Hebrew word. So, if you like keeping things easy, start with the H.

2. What did we just spell?

The word Hanukkah, by the way, translates to "dedication."

3. What was the dedication all about?

A brief history lesson: In 164 BC, the land Jewish people consider "the Holy Land" was ruled by a group that today would comprise parts of Syria and Greece. They wanted the people of Israel to assimilate, but a small band of Jews (led by a fellow named Judah the Maccabee) won a battle, reclaimed their temple in Jerusalem and rededicated it to the God of Jewish tradition.

4. Why, if it's about temple dedications, are there "eight crazy nights," as Sandler puts it?

Because, as legend has it, when the temple dedication team went to light the temple's menorah, they found only enough olive oil to last one day. Miraculously, that supply lasted eight whole days. And thus, Hanukkah was born.

5. Is it really about the oil lasting eight nights?

Maybe not. Other Jewish texts suggest it wasn't the oil burning

for eight days, but rather a delay in regularly scheduled programming that brought about the modern eight-day Hanukkah tradition. Because the Jewish people of Israel were still in caves fighting during September 164 BC, they didn't get to celebrate the eight-day holiday of Sukkot. The event was postponed until after the Jewish guerrillas won back Jerusalem and reclaimed the temple. Then, the event was back on, and thus Hanukkah was born.

6. The books that describe all of these events aren't in the

Hebrew bible. Where do we find them?

The books of Maccabees are the ones that describe the retaking of the holy land. And they aren't even in the traditional Hebrew bible. But they are in the Catholic bible. So, there's that.

7. The game of dreidel was inspired by an Irish game. What's up with that?

Besides the menorah, nothing is associated with the holiday traditions of Hanukkah quite like the dreidel. But few realize the game

itself comes from Ireland. Originally, the four-sided tops were painted with Latin words. The game dates to an era before the Roman empire. As the empire's trade routes expanded, the game spread across Europe and eventually became synonymous with Jewish culture.

8. The next "Thanksgivukkah" (sort of), is only 32 years away.

For those who don't know better, Hanukkah can seem like a Jewish Christmas. But it isn't that at all. Nor, despite its proximity in dates to Western holidays, is it

some kind of post-Thanksgiving buffer holiday. In fact, Hanukkah moves around. The Jewish calendar relies on lunar months of either 29 or 30 days. But the rest of the world goes on the Gregorian calendar. As a result, Hanukkah's start date can fall anywhere between November 27 and December 26 in any given year. The next time we see a Thanksgivukkah? 52 years (2070).

Bonus burning fact

Alabama retailers expecting double-digit growth in holiday spending for second straight year

The Alabama Retail Association is expecting that the 2021 holiday shopping season could be the second straight year seeing double-digit growth.

The association is expecting Alabamians to spend between \$14.79 billion to \$14.8 billion this year on gifts, besting last year's mark of \$14.78.

After shoppers spent part of last year indoors with COVID protocols, Alabamians spent 11.6 percent more during November

and December 2020 than they did during the same period in 2019, making it the highest holiday growth rate on record.

Nationally, retailers expect about 7 percent growth this year in holiday sales.

According to the Alabama Retail Association, this year has already seen almost 18 percent growth in taxed sales through the first 10 months of 2021. And for the second straight year, Alabama consumers have started their holiday shopping early, with October sales up almost 14 percent. That also keeps pace with a national trend, as shoppers hoped early action would avoid supply chain woes.

The association also expects Alabama consumers, like the rest of the nation, to shop more in store this year than last, spending more on travel and entertainment this holiday season than in 2020.
